CELEBRATING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY

This June we celebrate the 100th anniversary of Bishop Vasyl's birth. He was born on June

1, 1903 in his family home on Lypova Avenue in the city of Stanislaviv (now Ivana-Frankisk) in Western Ukraine. His birth was difficult, perhaps a foreshadowing of the life of suffering that was to be his lot. His mother Anna (nee) Teodorowych and his father Rev. Volodymyr Velychkovsky gave him the name of Vasyl Vsevolod. He was baptized in the Cathedral Church in Stanislaviv where his father was employed. Both his parents were from generations of priestly families. His birth fills us with gratitude to God. We have now come to

recognize how precious it is to have a martyr among us, one who walks this pilgrim journey to the

kingdom together with us. He is now our intercessor and healer.


RECENTLY BEATIFIED IN THE UKRAINIAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

June 27th will mark the second anniversary of the Feast day of Nicholas Charnetsky and 24 Companions. They were beatified by Pope John Paul II in Lviv two years ago along with others. There were many Ukrainian Catholics who suffered, were tortured and even killed under the Soviet Regime. When Pope John Paul II was planning his visitation to Ukraine, he asked the Ukrainian Church to prepare for him a list of their martyrs so that he could beatify them. Time was very limited. The committees had only a few months to gather all the necessary documentations and materials. The committee was only able to get approval for 25 of its martyrs. The most well known of them was Bishop Nicholas Charnetsky and since there existed already a cult of veneration at his grave site and reports of miracles through his intercession, his name was chosen to head this group of twenty-five Ukrainian Catholic Martyrs. Among the companions is our Blessed Vasyl Velychkovsky, C.Ss.R. and Nykyta Budka, the first Ukrainian Catholic Bishop of Canada, .

Along with Nicholas Charnetsky and 24 Companions, the Pope also beatified a martyred priest Father Emilian Kouch. He was killed in a Nazi concentration camp. He was arrested for the help he gave to the Jewish people. The kindness he showed them continued while he was in prison. His Feast day is also on June 27th.

The Pope also beatified a martyr, Bishop Theodore Romdza from Zakarpatia. Because of the dramatic way that he was killed for his faith in 1947, the Church had begun his process beatification soon after his death. The Pope took the opportunity of his visitation to make this proclamation. His Feast day is November 1st - the day of his martyrdom.

The Pope also raised Venerable Josaphata Hordoshewska, SSMI, the foundress of the Sister Servants of Mary Immaculate to the rank of Blesseds. After her heroic life was reviewed by the Vatican officials and a miracle through her intercession was con-

firmed, the road was cleared for her to be beatified. Blessed Josaphata's Feast day is November 20th.

happened since that time. Pilgrims from across Canada and the United States and even Europe have been coming daily to the Martyr's Shrine since it has been opened on November 5, 2002.

Shrine! A martyr is such a precious gift to the church. A martyr reflects to us the face of Christ. Like Christ the martyr gives his very life. The martyr chooses Christ above all else in his life and for this he pays the full price of faith. The martyr witnesses to us about commitment, resolve and faithfulness to the Gospel. Therefore a Martyr's

Shrine is a fountain of much grace. This we have seen so clearly with Blessed Martyr Vasyl and his intercession. His Shrine has become a place of pilgrimage, prayer, peace and healing.

Pilgrims have experienced a great peace in the shrine. They have experienced a renewal of their faith. Volunteers witness to us of changes which have taken place in their lives since they began serving the pilgrims at the shrine. Through Blessed Vasyl's interces-

sion, some people have survived massive heart attacks. cancers have seemed to disappear, various aches and pains been have relieved. Relationships have been healed. Almost weekly we receive someone witnessing to us of some favor they have received through Vasyl's Blessed intercession.

Pilgrims who come to the shrine, have the opportunity to visit the museum where they can learn more about his life and see some of the second class relics (things he used during his life). From the museum the pilgrims go to the shrine and spend time in prayer in the presence of his Holy Relics. A profound peace permeates the shrine and is becoming stronger and stronger through the many prayers of all the pilgrims.

One of the highlights of the Shrine was the visit of his Beatitude Cardinal Lubomyr Husar, the head of the Ukrainian Catholic Church. He spent much time in prayer at the shrine and in visiting the museum.

In 1938 Blessed Vasyl wrote a poem about his relationship to his mother. Here is a short exerpt of the beginning of this lengthy

Blessed Vasyl's

mother, Anna

poem:

Blessed May You Be, Mother!

In pain you bore him, with care you carried him, in prayer you educated him...

He was you one son:
your other sons died...
Your entire godly soul you wished
to transfuse into him.
Barely had he a few years
and already at the knees of his mother
he was learning the holy warmth of prayer,

which he would himself then lisp...

For she did not feel strong enough to safeguard her son: she herself was without strength. Only then was she strong when, on her knees she knelt at the foot of the Holy Table, at the feet of the Holy Icon of the Mother of God -oh yes, there she was strong! ...

There he, too, with his mother, kneels on his tiny knees;
"Pray, my son Pray...
Ask for this, as well,... And pray...
Pray: Dearest Mother of God
give me the grace to become
a holy priest, a monk!..."

And he prayed,
repeating the words after his mother
—he prayed.
And these last words of the prayer

—though he comprehended them not at all—
somehow were sown deep in his childish soul.

And he always prayed these words, even later, on his own...

TESTIMONY OF GRACES RECEIVED

January 29, 2003

In July 2002 I was visiting my sister at St. Benedict's priory "Sr. Bernadine". While there we went to the cemetery to visit the grave site of Blessed Bishop Vasyl Velychkovsky. We prayed, took pictures and some soil from the gravesite.

Up until then I had an inner ear infection, a viral one, called vertigo which causes dizzy spills, losing balance, losing your equilibrium. The day we were there was Saturday, July 20, 2002.

That evening when I went to bed I was not dizzy. I never lost my balance or anything. Sunday morning I got up as normal as ever. Prior to that I always experienced extreme dizziness on laying down, turning in bed, and upon rising.

I came home feeling fine. I told my doctor about it, then I left it alone to see if the miracle was permanent.

This week January 28, 2003, I went back to see my Doctor. We discussed the matter. I told him I'm still feeling good, having no dizziness. He's very happy for me and so am I. I feel very blessed and grateful. The doctor's comment last summer was "I guess we can use a lot of that."

I am claiming this miracle for God's glory and in thanksgiving for the blessings bestowed upon Bishop Vasyl Velychkovsky.
