IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY SCHOOL PILGRIMAGE



One of the missions of the Blessed Vasyl Velychkovsky Shrine is to have catechism classes and Catholic School children come to spend time with Blessed Vasyl. On November 22, 2017, the grade 5 & 6 classes from Immaculate Heart of Mary School (Winnipeg) spent a pilgrimage day at the Shrine.

A week earlier, our staff member, Kseniya Kravtchouk, had a presentation for these students about Blessed Vasyl's life. On the pilgrimage day 40 students arrived at the Shrine. The day began with the celebration of the Divine Liturgy. During the Liturgy, Fr. John Sianchuk spoke to the students about the meaning of a pilgrimage and the precious gift from God that Winnipeg has received - a Christian Martyr.

After the Divine Liturgy, the students were divided into two groups. One of the groups spent time in the museum where Mrs. Kravtchouk shared the various artifacts used by Blessed Vasyl and their significance during the underground church in Ukraine. Together with these artifacts, she related interesting and inspiring sto-

ries from Blessed Vasyl's life. The other group spent time with Ms. Mary Jane Kalenchuk in the Shrine. Here students discovered the meaning of the many symbols present in the chapel, the meaning of the holy relics of Blessed Vasyl and some of the graces and blessings that have already been received through his intercession.

After having lunch in the church auditorium, students were led in a project of making rosaries. These were very special rosaries, rosaries made of dark brown bread. Blessed Vasyl himself made made a rosary of bread while in prison and upon which he prayed constantly. Making these rosaries was very interesting and challenging for the students.

These were then placed into a special decorative box and taken to the Shrine. As they gathered in the Shrine, the students brought their icons of Blessed Vasyl which they had previously made in the classroom. These icons were blessed with holy water and the students were encouraged to create their own icon corner of Blessed Vasyl. Students prayed the prayer of intercession for all the petitions they had written. To complete the day, each student was anointed with holy oil blessed through the 1st Class Relics of Blessed Vasyl. Upon returning to their school, each student shared their impression and experience of the pilgrimage day.

Blessed Vasyl's Love for Children, the Poor, the Vulnerable and the Orphans

As we approach this time of Christmas/Epiphany, children often come into the spotlight. Seeing the Baby Jesus in the manger, reveals to us the vulnerability of children and the need to pay particular attention to them. Blessed Vasyl always had a heart for children, cared for them, catechized them and encountered them.

From an interview with Lybomyra Venhrynovich, she recalled that in 1928, when she was just a little girl, Blessed Vasyl came to her father's parish for a mission. Blessed Vasyl was then 25 years old. She remembers playing with him and that he pushed the swing on which she was swinging.

When Blessed Vasyl was pastor in Stanislaviv (1935-39), his heart went out to young women who had come from villages into the city and were often abused and became slaves for their "masters". He organized them and helped them to remain moral and free, giving them a good Christian upbringing.

In 1939, an eight month old child passed away near Stanislaviv according to Evdokia Sokol, the child's cousin. When Blessed Vasyl heard about it, he got on his bicycle and rode seven kilometers to the bereaving family to console them. They were grieving heavily, but Blessed Vasyl responded to them strongly saying that this baby was completely innocent and is now in heaven with the angels. This child did not need the ordinary funeral prayers for it was already in heaven. He thus consoled the grieving parents. As a young girl, Evdokia, remembered Blessed Vasyl's word of wisdom

throughtout her whole life.



Iryna Sokil

In 1944, Blessed Vasyl remained in Ternopil while the Soviet Front passed through. The city was filled with shelling and the dangers of war. From an interview with Iryna Sokil, we find this beautiful description: "I am an orphan. I have neither a mother nor father. My mother died when I was about three years old. He (Blessed Vasyl) was so good to the children. When I was fourteen, we were sitting in the basement during the shelling. It was wartime and shells were flying everywhere. He himself was sitting among us children. He looked after us and taught us. He was a man dedicated to the poor and to the orphans. He was a father. He even took his handkerchief and wiped my nose. There were other priests, but he took a special interest in me. He gave me peace of heart. He would say 'Irka, come with me' and we would walk together hand in hand throughout the city. I now understand that this time was a great grace for me. He took me into his life. "

From an interrogation by the KGB with Anisia Hirnyak, we hear these words: "I was in charge of an orphanage in Ternopil. Fr. Velychkovsky knew about us. He would come to us and ask us to truly care for these children and give them formation. Personally, he assisted us by giving funds and groceries. I remember that several times he gave us money for food and at times he personally came to work with us and bring us food."

We see Blessed Vasyl's heart through these examples - how he loved children, orphans and young people who were in danger of becoming lost. Blessed Vasyl continues through his intercession to help children and young mothers. There are numerous accounts of graces and miracles involving children through Blessed Vasyl's intercession. May Blessed Vasyl lead us to have a heart for the poor, the needy and the desperate, during this time of Christmas and beyond.

During our trips to Ukraine, we have continued this work of Blessed Vasyl in aiding orphans and in particular, vulnerable girls at risk for human trafficking. Recently, we received a letter from one of them.

"My name is Lylia. I am 14 years old. My sister Olena and I lived with my mother. I could not go to school for a while and I was very sad about that. I love my mother and I hope that everything goes well for her, but now she is in very difficult circumstances. As a result, my sister Olena and I were completely left alone, without family, without a home, without the help of adults. Then we met Sister Julia. We began to live together and shortly we learned that we have a large family of people whom we did not know, but who loved us and began to help us. This is you - you are our family living in Winnipeg in Canada. This is you - Mary Jane and Father John, and everyone who knows us!

I am in grade 8. I have a lot of friends at school and I like to spend time with them. I do not feel that I am worse than anybody else. Because of your help, I have good school clothes and shoes. I am now getting good grades in school.

I am taking computer courses and dream of becoming a computer programmer. We recently studied Photoshop and I really enjoyed it. Now we are studying how to create computer games. I also take private English, mathematics and Ukrainian classes. Private lessons have helped me to obtain good grades at school. I love to read about nature and learn new things.

In my spare time, I like crafts, creating greeting cards and covers for notebooks. My favourite subject in school is geography because it teaches me about the world. I dream of visiting tropical beaches where palm trees grow. I am very grateful that you all are helping me achieve my goal and my dream - to become a computer programmer."

TWO EXTRAORDINARY EVENTS IN UKRAINE

The Apartment/Museum in Lviv commemorated its 10th Anniversary in October. Blessed Vasyl's apartment was renewed 10 years ago and is now a place of prayer and pilgrimage. The day was marked by a full day of prayer and presentations to various groups of pilgrims.

On November 14th, there was a special presentation at the Patriarchial Cathedral of the Resurrection in Kyiv.

After the Divine Liturgy, Bishop Bohdan Dzyurakh introduced the program about Blessed Vasyl. Sister Tadea led the program during which the seminarians from Kyiv gave a short performance about Blessed Vasyl's life. Blessed Vasyl's relatives Cornelius Petryshyn and Iryna Kolomeyets also spoke about their uncle. The event was concluded with holy anointing.
