A TIME FOR PRAYER

Slava Ukraini! Heroiam Slava!

Over the past few months my eyes have been glued to the newscasts on the internet and television, following the events happening in Ukraine. We have seen a people become intensely aware of its identity and the values of freedom, religion and justice. We have seen a people defend these values in the face of fierce opposition unto the point of death. These same values were also held dearly by Blessed Vasyl.

As this article is being written, the events in Ukraine are changing so quickly that by the time it is published and by the time you read it, the situation could again be very different. Presently, the Russian forces are occupying the Crimean peninsula and the world leaders and diplomats are seeking some solution before there is an armed conflict and more lives are lost.

The conflict that has been present in Ukraine has



shown quite vividly - the face of evil. We saw the blatant lies of the former government officials; the outright disrespect of the human person and the disregard for human life. Medics who were members of the Red Cross were being attacked for helping the injured. Journalists were muzzled and fired at so that the story would not be told. People were being arrested without cause. Others were kidnapped and

had disappeared or were tortured and killed. People armed with nothing but their bodies, some sticks and stones, stood ground before those with bullets and grenades. In the end, close to a hundred people became "martyrs" for the cause of justice and for a Ukraine free from foreign tyranny.

As these event unfolded, it was difficult not to think of the circumstances of Blessed Vasyl. Although there was awareness in North America of oppressive reality of the Soviet Union, there was also a certain distance from those events. But today with the presence of modern media, the events of recent days echo to some degree the circumstances of Blessed Vasyl's life. The last 30 years of Blessed Vasyl's life was lived under the tyranny and oppression of the Soviet Union. The shocking events of recent days of torture and abuse of human dignity and freedom were the standard fare for Blessed Vasyl. On any day he could be called out for interrogation. Any one of his pastoral activities - his retreats, Divine Liturgies, catecheses, seminary training, celebration of sacraments, funerals, religious writings - could become a cause for his arrest, torture or even death. He lived this persecuted life every day. Yet, like the people on the barracks of the Maidan Square, he did not hide or withdraw from proclaiming the Gospel, rather courageously and without fear he continued to work tirelessly for the growth of the church and the salvation of souls.

Like the leaders of the opposition in Kiyy, Blessed Vasyl did not shrink from confronting the leaders of his day. On several occasions he confronted the government in Moscow about the injustice of his personal sentence and about the injustice of proclaiming the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church an illegal entity. He brought petitions to the Supreme Soviet to have at least some churches open for the Ukrainian Catholics. He did this courageously knowing that this could intensify persecution against him.

The people of the Maidan resisted the confrontation of the Berkut and other subversive

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forces and stood in the way of the bullet. Their courage for the sake of justice and freedom inspired the people of the whole country as well as



the whole western world. People rose up and also gained courage to confront the injustice of the system. They continue in this struggle. A martyr's sacrifice gives new life to others. Blessed Vasyl's martyrdom inspires us to a greater commitment to our Christian faith and Christian values. Blessed Vasyl was willing to die so that the Christian faith not be compromised nor diluted. He lived the life of God's compassion, mercy and forgiveness even towards his enemies.

He lived a life of prayer, knowing that the power of God was more wonderful than anything humans can achieve. On the Maidan, clergy from all faiths (Catholic, Orthodox, Protestant, Muslim,



Judaic) gathered hourly to prayer for God's protection, for victory over evil, for conversion of hearts and for peace. Many of the unexplainable events of the Maidan have been attributed to the direct intervention of divine power by church leaders and by the people. Blessed Vasyl believed that it was only through prayer that the

power of evil can be overcome. In his life also there were many instances where this victory was evident.

These recent events of the Maidan, no matter what outcome results in the near future, must not be forgotten for they reflect the best of the human spirit, that which needs to be emulated by others. So too, the life of Blessed Vasyl needs to be proclaimed to the world, for it crystallizes the response of faith in God that all of humanity needs to find and cultivate.
