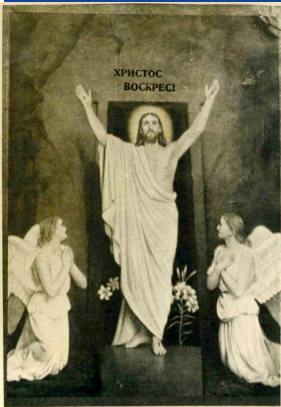

Bishop Velychkovsky National Martyr's Shrine

HOPE IN THE RESSURECTION



Holy Card from the Underground Church

Blessed Vasyl lived his life trusting in the hope of the Resurrection. He knew the ultimate outcome of everything that was happening, yet he continued to do his activities.

Here are some excerpts from those that knew him and were in prison with him..

"To celebrate the Divine Liturgy in the barracks was very dangerous, because in every barrack, there were at least ten spies, who were watching him particularly. There-

fore, on important holy days such as Easter, Christmas, etc. Father

celebrated the Divine Liturgy in the mine shaft. He also confessed us before the holy days, although that too was dangerous. When Father Velychkovsky confessed, it was profound. After confession, it always felt easier.

I talked with Father Velychkovsky about myself. After we became well acquainted, we began to share as believing persons, especially on Christian themes.

I loved to listen to him. He knew this and he loved to talk with me. I was depressed. I thought that the Soviet Union would be eternal, because it was a great power. They had military weapons. Those, who could do something to change this, were locked up in prisons. The ones, who were living in 'freedom', were the Communists

and the KGB. When the Soviet Union fell apart, I remembered his words: *"You will still live to see those days, when all will fall apart in one night. I probably will not live that long. Just as they systematically destroyed the churches, threw down the crosses, arrested the priests, so too with enthusiasm will those crosses be put back onto the churches. Many new churches will be built. You shall still visit many holy sites."* I argued with him and said: "That is impossible, that I still will be able to travel the world. No one will let me out." When I travelled to Australia, it became clear to me that Father Velychkovsky was a prophet. Behind that barbed wire, I could not even dream that I would go to Australia to see my brother, or to tour Canada.

I discussed with Father Velychkovsky and expressed my anger at the KGB and at the Soviet government. He said to me: "Don't curse them and destroy your nerves. Only pray for them as I do." Father Vasyl prayed for us and he prayed for

his torturers. It was strange to me, how one could pray for them. He said, *just like Jesus: "We must pray. May the Lord God forgive them, for they know not what they are doing."*

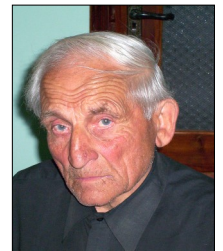
Father Vasyl knew how to advise and how to calm one down. I do not know where he got that power. He was a very humble person. He didn't do anything for show. He did not advertise his deeds. If a person was an unbeliever, he encouraged them with his quiet words, his philosophical logic, and with his straight talk. Father was approachable for all. He found a common language with ordinary people and also with intellectuals. There were various categories of people. There were those who were enlightened and those who had no culture and were vulgar. It seems to me that all the positive human attributes were found in the person of Father Velychkovsky. Besides this, he had a colossal faith in God and in Christ's Church. Whenever I looked at him, I thought: **"This man would be able to suffer various tortures, just like Christ and be ready to be crucified for the sake of others."** Boris Mirus

In 1955, Father Vasyl was released to the settlements. Which meant you were still part of the camp. Every morning and evening you checked in to the inspection.

Fr. Chezburak shared, "Whoever was transferred to the settlements, made money and their wives could come to them, to the Lithuanians, Latvians and the Ukrainians.

Before Easter on Saturday evening, in 1955, I gathered

3-4 Ukrainian women and went to Father Velychkovsky's, so that he would bless the Easter food (the paska) for us. Father Vasyl lived with another priest from Lithuania. They were very happy and invited us to their house. Father Vasyl blessed the paskas and wished us a happy Easter. He distributed small black and white holy cards of the Resurrection.

Father Josaphat Fedoryk had painted the Resurrection in the camp. From that painting, they made holy cards. Father Vasyl, together with the Lithuanian priest, worked in the settlements for the salvation of souls." Fr. Vasyl Chezburak

When Father Vasyl returned to Ukraine, he discovered that the Ukrainian Catholic Greek Church was declared illegal by the Soviets. This did not deter Father Vasyl, he immediately continued his ministry that he did in prison, to bring the Good News to the most abandoned. Blessed Vasyl lived in the hope of the Resurrection and shared that hope with others.

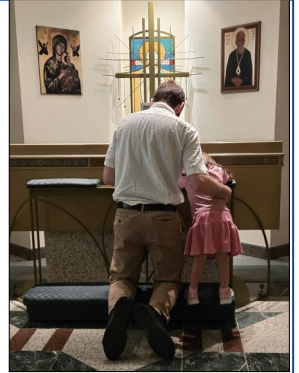

Devotion to Blessed Vasyl Impacting Lives Today

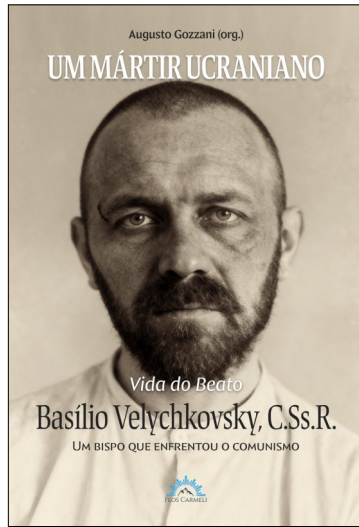

"The way I came to know about Blessed Vasyl is a little curious, even to me. I was writing about the arrest of a Ukrainian Catholic Bishop in the late 60s, for a screenplay (a personal project of mine), and did some research to know if something similar had actually happened. It might be something I heard in my childhood and forgot. Or some inspiration from the Holy Spirit. Blessed Vasyl is certainly connected to a personal project of mine now."

Since that first meeting, Augusto has responded to a call to share the story of Blessed Vasyl.

Augusto's homeland is Brazil, and he wants those who speak Portuguese to be able to read Blessed Vasyl's story. While working full-time and being a father to 2 young children, he created a project to translate Blessed Vasyl's autobiography. Working in collaboration with the Shrine Office and a publisher in Brazil, Flos Carmeli Edições Ltda. This vision has become a reality.

On March 26th, the Autobiography of Blessed Vasyl Velychkovsky in Portuguese will be officially launched.

The publication is now available in the Shrine Gift Shop and online.

Prayers through the intercession of Blessed Vasyl have been central to this project. We continue to pray for what may be in store next, to share his story and promote the cause of Blessed Vasyl.
